**Please renew memberships by March 1, horse needs USEF registration to be in show.
Please do not create entry on-line if you are paying by check – use paper entry. Please only create one entry in Horse Show Office – if you have created an entry and need to get back in, email marily2004@yahoo.com for a code.**

Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear. Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including Friday) must sign a USEF show release & waiver.

1. Class List: Please see Class List. All listed classes are to be held both days, unless otherwise noted on the class list. There are select classes listed on Friday. Tests used will be those current as of the USEF competition year, or in the case of Leadline, what is posted on www.amencornerfarm.com.

2. Awards: Introductory through FEI levels - Award and ribbon to 1st place, ribbon to 2nd through 6th place in each division (Open, Amateur, JR/YR) in each class. Qualifying classes (Great American and SWDC) are run concurrently with the division class, there will be no separate ribbons awarded. *Level Champions* for Saturday only will be awarded at each USDF/USEF level (Intro through Fourth) and combined FEI, for each division (O, AA, Jr) for Saturday tests only. The eligible tests are USDF Intro A, B, C and USEF Training Test 1 through Fourth Test 3 (no Freestyles, Young Horse, Equitation, Materiale, Opportunity, Leadline or other such test). At the discretion of management, there may be a Level Award for USEA levels combined. **There must be at least two competitors per division per level to receive a Level Champion award.** One *Freestyle Champion* for Open and for AA/JR will be awarded (all freestyle classes will be combined per stated division). **There must be at least two competitors per stated division to be eligible to receive this award.** The championship will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the highest score at the level. *Overall High Percentage Ribbons* will be awarded on Sunday for each champion of each division (O, A, J), and will be based on a simple high point percentage over the weekend tests that are eligible are USDF Intro and USEF Training test 1 – Fourth test 3, and FEI tests. Freestyles, Young Horse, Materiale, Equitation, Opportunity, Leadline or other such tests excluded. Other awards may be available by show time, check with the secretary for eligibility. Breed awards have been applied for, please submit copy of breed registry papers with entry if you wish to participate. Management is the sole arbiter of eligibility.

3. Entries: *If paying by credit card, please enter on-line at www.horseshowoffice.com (note change). If you choose to pay online, there is a convenience fee of 5%. You may also send paper entries or email (for a fee) to Marilyn (see below) with check. Questions regarding entry, contact marily2004@yahoo.com*

Membership/Non-Member/Proof of Membership fees: All participants (rider, owner, trainer, agent, lessee, or coach) must be current members of USEF or apply to USEF for a show pass. **Coaches and Trainers MUST be USEF members at time of entry submission, even if the “Trainer” is the parent of a minor. Non-member riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, longeurs, owners, lessees, and agents are allowed ONE Show Pass per competition year, which must be applied for and paid online to USEF PRIOR to show. If you have someone coaching you at the show, they must be listed as Coach, provide proof of USEF membership, and sign the USEF Entry Agreement form and waiver.** For USDF: All Riders and Owners must present a current membership card or pay the USDF non-membership fee per show. Those who cannot provide proof of their USDF membership may fill out an affidavit form and must pay the \$5 fee. The affidavit may also be used to verify horse registration and/or horse ownership. The USDF non-member fee is \$55. Horses must have a USEF registration or HID (horse identification number).

A. Entries and Fees for Shows: **1. Mail-In Entries:** Fill out one entry form for the show for each horse/rider pair. For each horse entered, send your completed entry form, including USDF & USEF membership cards & horse registrations (print from www.eqverification.org – one sheet), Coggins, vaccinations proof, signature pages for USEF waivers & release and USEF Federation page, and a check for the show, made payable to **Amen Corner Horse Shows** (no credit cards accepted using mail-in entries). Mail to Marilyn Kulifay, Entry Secretary, P.O. Box 3452, Houston, TX 77253. No post-dated checks accepted. The mail is slow – send mail in entries very early!

2. On-Line Entries (credit card payments): Go to www.HorseShowOffice.com Select “The First Dance” from the show listing and enter. It is quickest if you have your USEF/USDF horse numbers as well as your own. Select classes, fees, stabling, shavings & pay. You will receive a confirmation email and can use the link in that email to upload documents - Coggins, vaccinations & signature pages. Horse not officially entered until completed entry and payment received. If you start an entry and have to go back to it, contact marily2004@yahoo.com for a code. If you select “Pay by Check”, you must have your check in Judi Dauterive’s hand within three days and before the closing date.

3. Emailed Entries: Due by March 2. Must get check, made payable to **Amen Corner Horse Shows** to Judi Dauterive on or before March 2 at Amen Corner Farm, 27519 Polo Road, Folsom, LA 70437. Make sure you receive confirmation for entry.

B. Horse Show Office: Office assistance available beginning at 8:00 AM on Friday and one hour before first ride each show day, to one hour after the show each show day. Office may have limited hours on Thursday – will update competitors after closing date. Make sure to check in and get a bridle number before schooling. (New rule from 2024.) **At the Show:** No bridle numbers will be issued without full payment and completed entries, including signatures and emergency contact information.

C. Entry Acceptance: Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis based on On-Line Entry or received by date until classes are filled to the available judging time. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list (in the order of received by or on-line entry date). Those entries received after closing will be accepted at the discretion of show management, based on a space available basis and charged a late fee per show. Those on the waiting list who entered show prior to closing date and did not get into the show will have all fees refunded. NO PHONE or FAX entries. All entries must be made **on official entry blanks or on-line and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitors, owners, trainers, coaches, horse names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, USEF membership numbers for owner, rider, trainer and coach, USDF membership numbers for owner and rider, USEF & USDF horse recording numbers, and all signatures on release and waivers and include a copy of current Coggins and vaccinations proof and**

A GOOD EMAIL ADDRESS. Print copies of cards from www.eqverification.org (one sheet) if mailing your entry, online entry will do this automatically. Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released. Make sure that Emergency Contact information is complete. Releases and waivers are mandatory. All riders (and owners, trainers, coaches, parents) must sign waivers and releases. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. **Entries close & MUST BE RECEIVED BY Mar. 2, 2026, or entered on-line by Mar. 2, 2026.** ALL FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY. A \$50.00 NSF fee will be charged if the check is not honored by competitor's financial institution. Funds must be made good before a horse/rider can get a bridle number and compete. If after the show, funds must be made good within 5 business days and must be in the form of a cashier's check or money order and include the \$50.00 fee. Any changes in classes after the closing date are at the discretion of show secretary and will be charged a \$20.00 change fee. ONLY the Show Secretary may reassign rides.

D. Amen Corner Horse Shows and their show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, to reschedule classes; to change rings or rotate judges; to limit the number of rides per rider in order to facilitate the time schedule. All horses brought on the show grounds must provide current negative Coggins Test and vaccination proof **in advance**, complete an entry form and be issued a number. Non-showing horses must pay office fee and non-compete fee in addition to stabling or grounds fees.

E. Coggins: Entries must be accompanied by a copy of a Negative Coggins Test dated on or after March 18, 2025. **Horse's name on the Coggins form MUST MATCH horse's name listed on USDF/USEF Horse Recordings, or it will not be accepted. Entries must also include a proof of vaccination pursuant to USEF Rule GR845.**

F. Substitution Fees: After closing date, one horse may be substituted for another for a \$50.00 substitution fee per show, if horse status (USDF/USEF memberships) and classes and divisions (O, AA, Jr) entered are the same and a note is provided from a veterinarian that the entered horse has been injured or is ill. New separate entry form per show must be filled out with substituted horse's information, cards, Coggins and signatures as soon as possible. A horse may also be substituted for one that is sold. Sale papers must be shown to show secretary. If class and divisions are not the same, change fees will additionally apply. Depending on when substitution occurs, some changed classes may not be able to be scheduled. Adequate notice must be given to show secretary. Riders may be substituted for one another if the rider's status (and division) is the same regarding memberships and they are able to ride in the class that was entered by the original rider (i.e. open, amateur or junior) with a doctor's note that the entered rider became ill or injured. See above - must fill out new entry blanks with Coggins, signatures, etc. A horse or rider may be substituted, but not both.

G. Acknowledgement of Entries will be sent through HorseShowOffice. Make sure to check your spam folder if you have not received an acknowledgement of your entry, then email show secretary. Once acknowledgement has been received, please check carefully to make sure that your paperwork has been received and noted and that your information and classes are correct. If there is a problem, email the Show Secretary.

4. Official Ride Times: Tentative ride times will be uploaded to www.HorseShowOffice.com. You may also check www.amencornerfarm.com for ride times. Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after tentative times have been posted. A list of final ride times will be uploaded to www.HorseShowOffice.com by noon Thursday, March 12, however, if there are excessive scratches, the time schedule may be revised per the rules.

5. Stabling: Permanent stabling is available on the show grounds: 10' x 10' wooden stalls with doors. Tack stalls will be available at the same stall fee. No initial bedding will be provided, please purchase on entry form, \$12.00 per bag. Stalls will be available beginning Friday 8:30 am, March 13, unless you have signed up to arrive on Thursday. Please order all needed shavings before the show. During the show, additional shavings orders must be given to the office as soon as possible, but no later than 3:00 pm for that day's delivery.

6. Arenas/Footing: Competition arenas are 20m X 60 m outdoor arena with sand/limestone footing. An outdoor sand/limestone arena will be available for warm-up, with a separate arena for lunging (no lunging in warm-up arena). Introductory and Training Level (non-qualifying) classes may be ridden in a 20m X 40m arena, as well as applicable Para Equestrian and Eventing classes.

7. Farrier/Veterinarian: Veterinarian – Allison Barca, DVM, on call. Farrier – Jeff Perez will be on call. Contact information for both veterinarian and farrier will be posted at show grounds.

8. Location: Amen Corner Farm, LLC, 27519 Polo Rd., Folsom, LA. (985) 796-3712.

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS: From I-12 (from Hammond or Slidell), take exit #57, (the Madisonville/Goodbee exit for Hwy 1077) NORTH, towards Goodbee. Cross Hwy 190, continue north for 11.5 miles. NOTE: do not turn when Hwy 1077 takes a right, but KEEP STRAIGHT, and the road takes a sharp left, then sharp right to become Turnpike Road. Continue until you reach Polo Road on your left. The trailer entrance to the farm is just north of Polo Road on Turnpike Road. From New Orleans, once you have crossed the Causeway, continue straight on Hwy 190 up to I-12, head west on I-12, and proceed as above.

11. Refunds: No refunds after online closing date – Mar. 2 (except as outlined below). No refunds in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather, acts of God, terrorism, or other emergency. All requests for refund must be made in writing by the March 2 closing date. Entry fees (less the \$50.00 office fee and on-line entry fee) will be refunded only if the secretary receives the request on or before March 2, 2026. After March 2, in the case of severe illness or injury of horse or rider, a written request for refund, substantiated with a vet or doctor's note, respectively, competitor will get drug and qualifying fees refunded and at the discretion of management, may be eligible for a partial refund of stabling fees and/or shavings.

12. Dogs of a pleasant nature will be allowed on the grounds, but must be leashed at all times. No dogs will be allowed to be left tied in the aisles in the stabling area. **Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors.** Dog owners failing to comply with this rule are subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7 of the USEF General Rules, including warning cards. Loose dogs will be impounded, and the owner may be assessed a fine up to \$50.00 per occurrence. **No other pets or livestock other than dogs and horses/mules allowed on grounds.**

13. Concessions: Food will be available during limited breakfast/lunch hours.

14. Management: Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges.

15. Vaccination Documents - Competitor to provide flu/rhino vaccination proof with entry – must be within 6 months of show BUT should be no closer than 7 days before the show.

16. Freestyles: Freestyles should be submitted on thumb drives (preferred) or CDs to the show office upon check in. Sound check will be on Friday afternoon and/or other time posted at show grounds.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION RULES

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the **USEF drugs and medication program, 3780 Ridge Mill Drive, Hilliard, Ohio 43026-9231 . USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR HELMETS DR120.6 From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including noncompeting riders, riders on noncompeting horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Sharps Containers: Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents for up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.** If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering

the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

Safe Sport Statement: All USEF Life and Senior Active member, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about this can be found at www.usef.org

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

THE RULES MAY HAVE CHANGED FROM THE CURRENT RULE BOOK. IT IS THE COMPETITORS' RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK FOR ANY CHANGES. The listed rules are only general and are subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Directors of USEF. Current rules can be found on www.usef.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.



For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

- Current USEF/USDF cards must be included with entry. To be registered in Adult Amateur classes, your card must note your amateur status. Both rider and owner must be a member of USEF and a participating member of USDF for ride in qualifying classes to count. Owner may be a USDF Business Member.
- Horse's USDF & USEF registrations must be included.
- Horse flu/rhino vaccination record within 6 months prior to the show – name must match.
- USEF waiver signed for each person attending show – includes grooms, coaches, trainers, riders, owners, parents, etc.
- Make checks or money orders made payable to **Amen Corner Horse Shows**. Credit card entries must enter on-line through HorseShowOffice.

All entries using credit card for payment must use the online entry at www.HorseShowOffice.com

- Entries must be received on or before the closing date.

PLEASE NOTE: Any entry that does not include the above by date on cover page will be assessed an incomplete entry fee. Entry Fees must be paid in order to be in the show. Packets and ride times will not be distributed for incomplete entries.

2026 ProElite/USDF Breeders Championship Series Program Rules

The ProElite/USDF Breeders Championship Series (ProElite/USDFBCS) is a program intent on recognizing quality bloodlines and dressage prospects across the nation. Through a combination of in-hand and materiale classes, the ProElite/USDFBCS provides competition opportunities for dressage prospects and breeding stock.

- The ProElite/USDFBCS is scheduled on a calendar year basis. It starts January 1 and ends September 30.
- A series must have a minimum of two qualifying events to host a series final competition.
- Series boundaries are determined by USDF. Please be advised that the boundaries of any given series may cross the regional boundaries established for regular dressage competitions.
- All Dressage Sport Horse Breeding (DSHB) and ProElite/USDFBCS exhibitors and management are responsible for knowing the rules for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competitions holding DSHB classes, as well as USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions in general. The USEF Rule Book Dressage Chapter, Subchapter DR-2, contains the DSHB class rules, and can be found at www.usef.org.

I. PROELITE/USDFBCS IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP DIVISIONS

DSHB In-Hand classes provide evaluation of conformation and movement of horses of all ages for potential dressage horses and/or breeding stock.

A. IN-HAND CLASSES - HORSE REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS (PROELITE/USDFBCS QUALIFYING OR SERIES FINAL CLASSES)

CHART 1: USDF REQUIREMENTS FOR IN-HAND DIVISIONS	
HORSE	<p>Either USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) or USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) is required for all horses entered and must be submitted. Horses registered with a breed organization should have a copy of their registration papers submitted directly to USDF.</p> <p>Horses participating in ProElite/USDFBCS qualifying or series final competitions are not required to be registered with any breed registry. For registered horses the name of the breed, sire, dam, damsire, and breeder must be given on the entry blank. Horses not registered with a breed registry should be listed as “unregistered” on entry blank. For unregistered horses competing in DSHB classes, the breeding information is strongly recommended.</p>
OWNER	Owner is not required to be a USDF member for qualifying or series final competitions. If the owner does not have a USDF Participating, Group or Business membership, then a USDF non-member fee will apply.
HANDLER/ ASSISTANT HANDLER	Neither USDF membership nor a USDF non-member fee is required for the handler.
Elimination of a horse from its relevant class or series final class may occur should any USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications with related fees fail to be paid and/or collected by show management and submitted to USDF at the completion of a competition.	

B. REQUIREMENTS FOR PROELITE/USDFBCS IN-HAND QUALIFYING CLASSES

1. Classes must be offered and judged according to DR209.
2. Neither foals nor horses of any other age may be shown loose.
3. All qualifying competitions must offer every Sport Horse Prospect In-Hand and Breeding Stock In-Hand division of the ProElite/USDFBCS. The divisions are:
 - a. Current Year Foal Championship
 - b. Filly Championship

- c. Colt/Gelding Championship
 - d. Four-Year-Old Prospect Championship
 - e. Mare Championship (Breeding Stock)
 - f. Stallion Championship (Breeding Stock)
4. Only a single set of Sport Horse Prospect and Breeding Stock In-Hand DSHB qualifying classes may be offered per competition. These classes must be open to all horses and ponies of the appropriate age and sex, and not subject to any entry restriction.
 5. A separate qualifier championship class must be held for all divisions, even those that have only one class or one horse in the division. All horses must be re-evaluated by the judge(s) at both the walk and the trot in the championship class per DR210. If any one of the judges adjudicating this class has not previously judged all the horses in this class, conformation must also be reevaluated on every horse.
 6. Qualifier championship classes must be open to first and second place winners of their respective In-Hand qualifying classes as listed in Chart 2 below. Organizers have the option of including third placed horses in qualifier championship classes. No scores are given. Ties are not allowed. The champion and reserve champion of each division at each qualifier event are eligible to compete in their respective ProElite/USDFBCS Final championship class. A third-place horse in each championship class must be named as well.
 7. Current Year Foals ARE NOT ALLOWED in Filly Championship and Colt/Gelding Championship classes. Fillies of Current Year and Colts/Geldings of Current Year will compete in the same Current Year Foal Championship.
 8. Four-Year-Old Prospect mares and Four-Year-Old Prospect stallions/geldings will compete against each other in the same Four-Year-Old Prospect Championship.
 9. Mare classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status (as of January 1st of the current competition year), as in the following examples:
 - a. Four-Year-Old & Older Maiden Mares
 - b. Four-Year-Old & Older Yeld Mares
 - c. Four-Year-Old & Older Broodmares
 10. Stallion classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status, as in the following examples:
 - a. Four-Year-Old & Older Stallions Showing Only In-Hand
 - b. Four-Year-Old & Older Stallions Showing Also Under Saddle
 11. Note the following clarification on “stallion”: No geldings may compete in the ProElite/USDFBCS classes for stallions even if they are gelded after qualifying for the finals and are breeding via frozen semen.
 12. Each horse may only enter the ProElite/USDFBCS qualifying class(es) for which it is eligible and may only qualify for the specific ProElite/USDFBCS championship class(es) for that division(s). Four-Year Old Mares & Stallions may show in both the Four-Year Old Prospect class AND their respective Breeding Stock class.
 13. Geldings of any age may NOT show in breeding stock classes/categories. Geldings, age four and under, may show ONLY in sport horse prospect classes.
 14. All classes must be judged using the correct score sheet for appropriate category percentages. Sport horse prospects four years old and under MUST be evaluated on the current USDF Dressage Sport Horse Prospect In-Hand score sheets and mare and stallion breeding stock MUST be evaluated on the current USDF Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Stock score sheets.
 15. During awards ceremonies, each division champion and reserve champion must be named ProElite/USDFBCS qualifying champions and reserve champions for the show and be awarded a qualifier ribbon that is supplied to the show by USDF. Announcements must identify sponsors and horses’ breeding information. If a champion and/or reserve has already qualified for a final, the third-placed horse from the pertinent qualifying championship class will be eligible to compete in a final. Qualifying ribbons are still awarded to the champion and reserve champion, the third-place horse will not receive a qualifier ribbon.
 16. Any horse receiving a 75.000% or higher in its age/sex class is eligible to compete in the ProElite/USDFBCS Finals, independent of whether they go forward to a qualifying championship class.
 17. A list of qualified horses is maintained on the USDF website.
 18. All champions and reserve champions will be eligible to compete in **ANY** ProElite/USDFBCS Final, regardless of where qualification is earned, but may compete in only **one** series final competition per calendar year.

C. CONDUCT OF SERIES FINAL IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

1. At least two USEF DSHB judges must officiate in each series final class. Placings will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. At least one judge must be a USEF DSHB 'R' judge.
2. Ties in series final classes must remain unbroken. Examples:
 - a. If there are two champions, there is not a reserve champion.
 - b. If there are two reserve champions, the next place will be 4th place.
3. A grand champion and reserve grand champion for each division will be named at each ProElite/USDFBCS Final event and will receive awards and prizes provided by USDF. Third through sixth place horses will receive ribbons provided by USDF. After the last ProElite/USDFBCS Final held in a competition year, certificates will be available from USDF via the website.
4. USDF reserves the right to change, alter, or retract any placings and/or prizes for up to 60 days after the last day of competition if an error or violation is discovered.
5. Each horse must be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and stand for conformation. Callbacks are permitted only if stated in the prize list or program (DR209).
6. The owner **must enter** the qualified horse in the appropriate ProElite/USDFBCS Final championship class. The horse is NOT automatically entered in the series final championship class because it qualified earlier in the day or at another show. Series final events must allow late entries in series final classes for horses that qualified after the official closing date.
7. Management must collect all USDF non-member, membership and/or horse registration/HID applications and related fees prior to the start of a series final class for eligible entries to compete in the class. Should the required USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications and related fees fail to be submitted to USDF following the completion of a series final competition, elimination of a horse from its series final class may result.

II. PROELITE/USDFBCS Materiale Championship Division

DSHB Materiale classes provide evaluation of movement and rideability under saddle of three, four, and five-year olds as potential dressage riding horses.

A. MATERIALE CLASSES - HORSE REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS (PROELITE/USDFBCS QUALIFYING OR SERIES FINAL CLASSES)

RIDER	Rider is required to have a current USDF Participating Membership at the time a horse's qualifying score is earned and at the time of the ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class.

Elimination of a horse from its relevant class or series final class may occur should any USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications with related fees fail to be paid and/or collected by show management and submitted to USDF at the completion of a competition.

B. REQUIREMENTS FOR PROELITE/USDFBCS MATERIALE QUALIFYING CLASSES

1. Classes must be offered and judged according to DR134 & DR204 and the directives on the score sheet.
2. Dressage Competitions and DSHB Competitions may offer Materiale classes in the following categories:
 - a. Three-year old Fillies Materiale
 - b. Three-year old Colts and Geldings Materiale
 - c. Four-year old Mares Materiale
 - d. Four-year old Stallions and Geldings Materiale
 - e. Five-year old Mares Materiale
 - f. Five-year old Stallions and Geldings Materiale
3. Qualifying competitions may combine age groups but not different sexes. Fillies and/or mares may not be combined in classes with colts, geldings and/or stallions except in championship materiale classes (DR204).
4. Two numbers (min. 3" x 5") must be provided to and worn by Materiale class entries and they must be positioned on each side of the saddle pad.
5. Scores must be awarded to all competitors competing in materiale classes.
6. A horse may qualify to compete in a ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship Final by receiving one score of 72.000% or higher in a materiale class held at any USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized DSHB or Dressage competition during the relative competition year.
7. Scores earned at competitions licensed by USEF as Regular or Local competitions are not eligible to be used as qualifying scores for the ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championships.
8. The ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championships will run on the same calendar year as the ProElite/USDFBCS (January 1-September 30). Qualifications to compete in a ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class must be earned in the calendar year that the championship occurs.
9. Qualifying scores to compete in a championship class may be earned up until the championship class occurs. Materiale scores earned at dressage competitions held after all ProElite/USDFBCS Finals in a competition year, are not eligible as qualifying scores.
10. A list of qualified horses is maintained on the USDF website.
11. A horse may qualify with a different rider than the rider who competes the horse in the championship class.
12. All qualified horses will be eligible to compete in ANY ProElite/USDFBCS Final, regardless of where qualification is earned, but may compete in only one series final competition per calendar year.

C. CONDUCT OF SERIES FINAL MATERIALE CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

1. At least two USEF DSHB judges must officiate in each ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class. Placings will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. At least one judge must be a USEF DSHB 'R' judge.
2. Series final events must hold materiale classes allowing for qualification opportunities prior to holding the ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes.
3. **Two** numbers (min. 3" x 5") must be provided to and worn by Materiale class entries and they must be positioned on each side of the saddle pad.
4. Scores must be awarded to all competitors.
5. Ties in ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes must remain unbroken.
6. Materiale Championships will be held at each ProElite/USDFBCS Final competition. All qualified horses regardless of sex will compete against one another in their respective age groups. Each ProElite/USDFBCS Final will hold the following divisions:
 - a. Three-year old Fillies, Colts and Geldings Materiale
 - b. Four-Year-Old Mares, Stallions and Geldings Materiale
 - c. Five-Year-Old Mares, Stallions and Geldings Materiale

7. Horses will be evaluated according to the criteria listed on the current “USDF Materiale Class” score sheet, and classes must be conducted according to the current USDF “Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes”.
8. A grand champion and reserve grand champion for each division will be named at each ProElite/USDFBCS final event and will receive awards and prizes provided by USDF. Third through sixth place horses will receive ribbons provided by USDF. After the last ProElite/USDFBCS Final held in a competition year, certificates will be available from USDF via the website.
9. USDF reserves the right to change, alter, or retract any placings and/or prizes for up to 60 days after the last day of the championship if an error or violation is discovered.
10. Owner must enter the qualified horse in the horse’s appropriate ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class prior to commencement of the class. The horse is NOT automatically entered in the class because the horse qualified earlier in the day or at another show. ProElite/USDFBCS Final events must agree to allow late entries in the ProElite/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes for horses that qualified for the championship after the official closing date.
11. Management must collect all USDF non-member, membership and/or horse registration/HID applications and related fees prior to the start of a series final class for eligible entries to compete in the class. Should the required USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications and related fees fail to be submitted to USDF following the completion of a series final competition, elimination of a horse from its series final class may result.

III. PROELITE/USDFBCS FINALS PROSPECT AWARDS

At each ProElite/USDFBCS Final, a Three-Year-Old Prospect Award and a Four-Year-Old Prospect Award will be presented to the Three-Year-Old and Four-Year-Old horses earning the highest combined scores from their respective in-hand and materiale series final championship classes. USDF will provide each ProElite/USDFBCS Finals with the prizes for the Three-Year-Old Prospect and Four-Year-Old Prospect Awards that must be presented to the winners at each competition.
